




THE POPULAR TELEVISION SERIES

NEGAR NASEH

NEGAR NASEH (b. 1984) made her debut as an author in 2013 with the novel *During All This Winter*. *During All This Winter* is partly a novel about a complicated mother-daughter relationship with the Westrobothnian forests as backdrop, but it also consists of a work journal about the writing process: a way of inviting the reader to a conversation about reading and writing. The book was praised by critics and nominated for the **Borås Tidning's Debutant Prize** in 2014.

ELISABETH ÅSBRINK, BORN 1965, is one of Sweden's most prominent non-fiction writers. She has written several praised books on historic and current topics, and has reached a widespread audience, especially with 1947. When Now Begins and And in the Vienna Woods the Trees Remain.

ÅSBRINK WAS NOMINATED for The August Prize for her first three books and won it for best nonfiction book 2011 for And in Vienna the Trees Remain. In addition to The August Prize, the book has been awarded the Danish-Swedish Cultural Foundation Culture Award in 2013, and Rychard Kapuscinski Award for best literary reportage in 2013.

ARE WOMEN FEMALES or humans? Are men masters or slaves? Is marriage a business arrangement, an act of love, or a prison sentence? Should Christian morality or reason prevail?

THE QUESTIONS FORMULATED during the second half of the 19th century set Europe ablaze, and it was authors and intellectuals in the Nordic countries who ignited the fuse. At the centre was the Danish literary critic Georg Brandes, joined by Henrik Ibsen, August Strindberg, Elisabeth Grundtvig, and Anne-Charlotte Leffler, to name a few.

VICTORIA BENEDICTSSON EMERGED like a shooting star in the sky of literary realism. The postmaster's wife from a peripheral Swedish village made her literary debut at age 33, charging straight into the center of the action under the pen name Ernst Ahlgren. She befriended (or antagonised) all of the era's key players and her books took on the hottest issues of contemporary debate.

IN HER NEW biography, Elisabeth Åsbrink has carefully retraced Victoria Benedictsson's steps. She has charted the background of Benedictsson's personal drama in a turbulent time in history; she has read letters, diaries, short stories, and novels in order to shed light on the inner landscape of a prodigious figure and a period in which the Nordic countries went from being governed by Christianity to embracing modernity and science.

THIS IS A biography of a thinking woman who tried to shatter the constraints of gender and ended her life in a crescendo of emotions, in a time obsessed with literature, sex, and death.

WINNER OF THE August Prize for best nonfiction 2011, the story of the complicated long-distance relationship between a Jewish child and his forlorn Viennese parents after he was sent to Sweden in 1939, and the unexpected friendship the boy developed with the future founder of IKEA, Ingvar Kamprad. Otto Ullmann, a Jewish boy, was sent from Austria to Sweden right before the outbreak of World War II.

DESPITE THE HUGE Swedish resistance to Jewish refugees, thirteen-year-old Otto was granted permission to enter the country—all in accordance with the Swedish archbishop's secret plan to save Jews on condition that they convert to Christianity. Otto found work at the Kamprad family's farm in the province of Småland and there became close friends with Ingvar Kamprad, who would grow up to be the founder of IKEA. At the same time, however, Ingvar was actively engaged in Nazi organisations and a great supporter of the fascist Per Engdahl. Meanwhile, Otto's parents remained trapped in Vienna, and the last letters he received were sent from Theresienstadt.

WITH THOROUGH RESEARCH, including personal files initiated by the predecessor to today's Swedish Security Service (SÄPO) and more than 500 letters, Elisabeth Åsbrink illustrates how Swedish society was infused with anti-Semitism, and how families are shattered by war and asylum politics.
